Then, it would be a game of "musical chairs" for county offices, the existing community corrections building has reached it's limit. Building this re-entry facility would become the new home for the corrections department. But, future neighbors don't like the idea.

The idea of a re-entry facility connected to the jail is not a new one. Take a look at this drawing of the jail plans back in the early 1980s. The plan was to build the jail with a community corrections facility attached to it. Because of a lack of funding, that didn't happen.
